We did it.!! At the start of the year, the 26 boys sat together and planned to win the flag. We worked on a game-plan and practiced and practiced what we thought was a winning formula. After losing the last two rounds, you could expect that the belief may have been somewhat diminished – but not this group. They rose to the occasion in two big finals against Northvale to achieve our goal – and they are now Premiership Players.

The day started with the National Anthem and in front of a huge crowd – a big thank you to all of the Dingley community (not just the footy club) who came to support the boys. The boys were focussed, having heard some inspiration from 4 of the best coaches ever – Hafey, Jeans, Kennedy and Barassi..... check it out AFL Legends Coaches - Jeans, Kennedy, Barassi and ...

The first 5 minutes of play were intense and scrappy, with Northvale managing a point before we moved the footy the length of the ground to score the first goal of the game.... a relief and great for the boys to settle the nerves. From this point on, the game was goal for goal but we felt our footy was good and we were moving the ball well, sharing it and running to spread and open up the opposition. Leigh (Lethal) Murphy. Thanks darling, for all your support. When I was stressed and worried about the footy stuff, you provided some perspective and kept me in line.


