

SOME WHARFAGE STATS

With effect from December 1st 2015, payment of wharfage fees has been solely through TryBooking. The response from members over the summer has been fantastic with all but a few nights' wharfage being paid online.

The figures below are preliminary and include all online payments to date - 4 payments are outstanding and are not included.
