Just now you will see this frame hanging off our wharf toward the southern end and Andrew will visit quite regularly to measure and take samples (salinity, pH and temperature) surrounding this activity. We have already mounted in the recreational room a board with details and photos of this project and how it will hopefully work whilst in the waters of Queenscliff.

We thank CSIRO and Andrew for his interest and wish him every success which will hopefully bring all of us closer to being able to manage our own antifouling in a more environment friendly manner in the future! Good luck Andrew.
