



ENIS SALOPEK REFLECTS ON A DECORATED CAREER

THE Salopek family have had a long, proud and successful history with the Parkside Football Club.

Brothers Enis, Goran and Stretch have played more than 1000 games for the Magpies.

But it isn't just their on-field achievements that are of note, it is their dedication and support of the club off the field that is what makes the Salopek family a special one.

A chapter in their family history with Parkside will close this season as Enis has decided to hand up his boots.

Enis' WRFL career spans more than 30 years, more than 400 games and includes an amazing seven premierships.

"I have played in seven grand finals and not lost one," he said.

The 40-year-old said he still remembers his first game footy he played with Parkside back in 1983.

"I have been playing footy with the club since I was seven year's old, I started in Under-9's and have continued to play."

Enis said his career highlight was winning the 1999 premiership alongside his brothers.

He said playing with his brothers and being able to celebrate their flag success together is something he will never forget.

"Parkside also won the seniors and reserves premierships in 1996, that was great to be a part of and winning the 2003 Division 1 flag was special," Enis said.

Nicknamed 'Angry', Enis said Parkside was an extraordinary club with a great group of people involved.

"Parkside is special," he said.

"I have made a lot of close mates at the club, we all grew up in the area, and now the younger guys have come on board. "We are a tight nit group."

Parkside president Shannon French said players at the club walk a bit taller when Enis is around.

"He is the sort pf player that when you take to the field you know he has your back 100 per cent," he said.

"I have been lucky enough to play alongside him and it has been an absolute pleasure to be able to pull on the

jumper and go to war with him each week."

French said Enis has been a star player over the years and will be sorely missed in 2017.

"He has always been involved with the club, his family does the canteen and whenever the club has any sort of troubles, he has always been there, so of course we will miss him."

Nowadays, Enis is playing in Parkside's Division 3 Reserves side.

The Magpies are currently sitting in second spot on the ladder, having won 12 games and lost one.

They will take on Tarneit on Saturday in a top-of-the-table clash at Henry Turner Reserve.

Enis is hoping he can extend his premiership tally to eight at the end of the season.

"It has been good year," he said.

"The seniors have had a couple of losses and we are looking okay, we have only dropped the one game.

"Hopefully we can finish off the year on a good note."

On Saturday, the club will also be holding a 20 year reunion of their 1996 Seniors and Reserves premierships.

Past players, officials, supporters and families are all encouraged to attend the function.

"From those teams I am the only one still playing footy," Enis said.

Festivities will kick-off at 12noon.

TRIO INVITED TO NATIONAL DRAFT COMBINE

EIGHTY of the best junior players from across the country will do their best to impress AFL clubs at the NAB AFL Draft Combine in October.

Of the 80 players invited to attend the four-day trial, three are from the Western Jets.

Rising stars, Oscar Junker, Judah Dundon and Daniel Venables have been invited to test their skills at the combine.

Junker and Dundon, both have spent time in the WRFL, while Venables hails from Keilor.

Before the talented duo joined the Western Jets in the TAC Cup, Junker and Dundon were teammates at the Werribee Districts.

All three players were involved in the recent Under-18 National Carnival and have all caught the eye of AFL list managers.

Junker played most of his junior career with Werribee Districts and represented the WRFL on two occasions at the AFL Victoria Metro Championships.

After overcoming an injury at the beginning of the year, the Jets co-captain has put together a solid year of football.

Western Jets manager Shane Sexton said Junker is a versatile player who had many appealing attributes.

"He had an interrupted pre-season, he had a surfing accident just after Christmas and missed a dozen weeks," he said.

"So he had a later start to the season, but was selected in the Vic Metro side for the Under-18 championships.

"He is a consistent player, he can play across the centre and has the capacity to go forward, he has great overhead marking and is great left foot kick."

As well as playing for the Jets, Junker also played one game for Werribee Districts Under-19 Division 1 team this year.

Dundon has also played with the Tigers and represented the WRFL at the Junior Metro Championships in 2012 and 2013.

The young star also got the chance to play one game

with VFL club Williamstown.

Sexton said he has had a terrific season so far despite having some leg issues during the pre-season.

"He fractured his leg, but has recovered well and played eight games for us this year," he said.

"He will be fit and ready for the draft combine in October."

Venables has also had a standout year, with commentators predicting he is a player who will likely find an AFL home come draft day.

Venables was named in the All-Australian side following an impressive display at the national carnival and has also played some great footy at school level.

"Hopefully these boys can do well at the combine and go on to get drafted," Sexton said.

"That would be fantastic."

On the TAC Cup front, the Western Jets have had a difficult season, managing only four wins from 15 matches.

At the weekend the club suffered another big loss, losing by 62-points to the Dandenong Stingrays.

"It has been a frustrating season," Sexton said.

"We have had our chances in games, but unfortunately we haven't been able to challenge many teams.

"We will get some of our players back for our remaining games, so hopefully we can make the most of our opportunities."

The Western Jets will next take on the Bendigo Pioneers at the Queen Elizabeth Oval on August 14 at 12pm.

Their final game of 2016 will be against the Calder Cannons at RAMS Arena on August 20.

Part of the money raised from the event will be donated to the Muir family.


The Legend's Match will be played at JR Parsons Reserve on August 12 at 7pm.

The reigning premiers have the points calculator working overtime for the last two weeks of the season, honing the best 22 to create history.



TOP TWO TEAMS READY TO BATTLE

RYAN Harrington's round-high six goals helped his Werribee Districts side to an 80-point mauling over St Albans.

The Saints started the stronger side, recording seven scoring shots to three in the first quarter, but kicked just one goal and six behinds from those shots.

The Saints were shut down for the rest of the game as Werribee's defensive prowess shone through, St Albans kicking just one goal and four behinds in the final three quarters.

The game was still to be won heading into the final term, however, as the Districts were ahead by just 18-points after only recording four behinds in the third quarter.

Ten goals in the last quarter sealed the 15.12. (102) to 2.10. (20) victory and gave the Districts a nine percent increase in its percentage, keeping it ahead of chasing Altona on the ladder.
