# PRESIDENT

At the end of a successful 2012 WRFL football season, I am pleased to report that football in the Western Region is in good shape and that the League is well positioned to meet the challenges ahead. With all of the key tasks set in the 2010 Strategic Plan now completed, the League has established a sound administrative base with the capacity to properly service its member clubs and to guide the expansion of club and team numbers in the years ahead.

Perhaps the most significant achievement of the past three years under the current Board was completed this year. A major review of the League's rules and governance culminated in June 2012 with the unanimous adoption of a new Statement of Rules, replacing the former Constitution and Rules. The new rules not only resolved the conflicts and omissions inherent in the previous documents, but most importantly clearly defined the role of an independent Board in the League's governance structure. A thorough review of the League's By-laws is now in progress under the guidance of the Rules Review Sub-Committee, chaired by Mick Psaila. The revised By-laws will be in place in time for the 2013 football season.

My thanks to Mick Psaila and all of those who have served on the Rules Review Sub Committee over the past twelve months, undertaking this important work on behalf of all member clubs.

The Western Region of Melbourne is currently the fastest-growing population base in Australia. The 2010 Strategic Plan recognised the opportunities presented by that growth and articulated strategies to leverage the expanding population to increase football participation across the region. The first signs of success of those strategies are now evident, with two newly-formed clubs admitted to membership of the WRFL for the 2013 season.

AFL Victoria has also recognised the opportunities presented by the growing population of both the western and northern regions of Melbourne. The AFL Victoria Western and North West Region Future Directions Project was instigated during the 2012 season, aimed to "provide recommendations regarding the best structure for football competitions in these regions that will:

1. Support sustainable Clubs
2. Focus on increasing participation at all levels
3. Maximise the future growth potential within the area"

AFL Victoria has appointed a Project Officer as a full-time resource for the review, working with the WRFL and other leagues across the region. The WRFL

Board is cooperating in the review process and we look forward to the project outcomes, particularly those with potential to increase resources to football in our region.

WRFL/Western Jets players again featured prominently in the recent AFL National Draft with Spencer White (Spotswood FC) at pick No. 25 to St Kilda; Lachlan Hunter (Williamstown Jnr FC) at pick No. 49 to Western Bulldogs; and Majak Daw (Wyndhamvale FC) upgraded by North Melbourne from its rookie list. We wish those players every success for their future football careers and will follow their progress with both pride and interest.

Of course, very few of those who start their football journeys at community level will be fortunate enough to forge a career at AFL level. The WRFL provides the opportunity for more than 6,000 junior and senior players to enjoy their own levels of achievement and fulfilment in a team-sport environment. We are equally proud of the achievements of each and every one of the players and umpires, both male and female, who represent our clubs and their League at both junior and senior levels throughout the football season.

In junior ranks, a total of seven representative teams were selected in 2012 to compete in WRFL colours as part of a comprehensive Junior Interleague program. Congratulations to all of those who were selected as interleague representatives, and thank you to all of the coaches, team managers, trainers, assistants and parents who contributed to the success of the program.

The junior football season culminated with a total of fifteen Grand Finals across the age-groups and grades. The post-season junior presentation function was a sell-out at Wyndham Cultural Centre, reflecting the pride and enjoyment experienced by players, club officials, families and friends alike.

At senior level, Altona Football Club won its first ever Division 1 Grand Final, defeating perennial finalists Spotswood in a cliff-hanger by a single point. The game was a fine example of skill, courage and sportsmanship – a fitting testament to the image and standard of WRFL football.

In Division 2, Yarraville-Seddon Eagles held off a brave Parkside to triumph in another high-standard Grand Final. The Eagles will return to Division 1 in 2013, following four years of rebuilding in Division 2.

Congratulations to all teams that competed in the 21 Grand Finals, junior and senior, in season 2012; and particularly to those who enjoyed the ultimate success of winning a premiership cup.

The task of staging the WRFL finals series becomes more complex as our competition expands. This year, a total of 112 finals games were played over a seven week period in August/September at five venues across the region. We are grateful to Wyndham and Hobsons Bay Councils and to Westbourne Grammar School for their assistance and cooperation in providing the venues used for our finals. Unfortunately, there are insufficient event venues across the western region to meet our growing needs. The Board and administration will need to address the venue shortage with local and state government authorities as a matter of urgency.

The Western Region Football League has established strong relationships with a range of organisations across the region. In addition to the five local government Councils (Maribyrnong, Hobsons Bay, Brimbank, Wyndham and Melton), we enjoy the strong and growing support of a wide range of sponsors, including the Western Bulldogs Football Club, Werribee Football Club and the Williamstown Football Club. We have also committed to supporting the work of the EJ Whitten Foundation as our ongoing community partner.

Our valued sponsors are listed and acknowledged elsewhere in this report. I extend our thanks and gratitude to all of the sponsoring partners who have supported the League financially in 2012. We could not exist without the support of those sponsors and I encourage all associated with the WRFL to reciprocate support to those businesses wherever possible.

The links between football bodies in the west are strong across AFL, VFL and community levels. We are grateful for the continuing support of the Western Bulldogs, Werribee and Williamstown Football Clubs, all of whom support the WRFL financially and in the delivery of football programs. We look forward to further strengthening those relationships to underpin the continued growth of football in Melbourne's west.

Our fund-raising support for the EJ Whitten Foundation in 2012 resulted in presentation to the foundation of a cheque for \$10,000 in October. The foundation directs its funding to promotion of important men's health messages and to research into the treatment of testicular cancer. The WRFL is proud to be associated with the EJ Whitten Foundation, particularly given the status of the football legacy of Ted Whitten Snr and his origin in the FDFL/WRFL at Braybrook Football Club. Plans are already afoot to increase our support for the foundation in the years ahead.

Thanks to League's small but able band of staff, led by CEO Bob Tregear, who have worked so hard throughout the past year to deliver the outcomes set by the Board.

Thanks also to my fellow Board members who have all taken seriously their responsibilities to provide sound, responsible and independent governance of the affairs of the League. Treasurer Dominic Drenen and directors Mick Psaila and Terry McGarity have all nominated for re-election at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting and will be declared elected, unopposed. I congratulate them and thank them for their ongoing commitments.

Finally, thank you to all of the club officials, parents and supporters who have contributed to the work and success of the WRFL in season 2012. I wish you all best wishes for the festive season and look forward to working with you again in season 2013.

## CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

The 2012 football season was one of significant achievements, despite the many challenges presented in a difficult social and economic environment. The value of a sound strategic planning and management process was vindicated by the achievement of virtually all of the targeted outcomes set out in the League's 2010 three-year Strategic Plan. On the playing field, outstanding finals series at both senior and junior levels; continued growth in junior team numbers; the introduction of Under 12 Girls and Youth Girls competitions; and further advances in umpiring standards and numbers were some of the stand-out results.

The Strategic Plan target of 300 umpires by July 2013 was achieved a full year ahead of schedule, with 307 active umpires on the books at the end of the 2012 season. In just three short years, umpire numbers have grown from a critically low base of 126 in March 2010, driven largely by a successful academy program overseen by Mark Westgarth and Terry O'Donnell.

While nearly 60% of our umpires are under the age of 18 years, umpiring standards have also shown marked improvement under the guidance of Umpires Manger Shane Carland. Shane took-on the role in difficult circumstances at the start of the 2010 football season and has overseen a renaissance in WRFL umpiring. He announced his retirement from the position on the eve of the 2012 finals series, leaving a legacy not only of growth in numbers and improved standards, but also of harmony and goodwill amongst the umpiring group. Thanks to Shane for a job well done – it is hoped that he will be able to maintain some level of involvement in the ongoing development of WRFL umpires.

The challenge of capitalising on the achievements in umpiring and of further improving standards and professionalism will be in the hands of recently appointed Director of Umpiring Mark Westgarth. Mark is a former VFL/AFL senior field umpire and professional teacher who has managed our successful umpiring academy at MacKillop College Werribee over the past four years. While further growth in umpire numbers will be a constant challenge, Mark's primary focus will be on developing the skills and performance levels of umpires.

Another of the key deliverables of the 2010 Strategic Plan was to "develop and implement strategies to minimise operating costs to clubs". Historically, the long-established practice was to increase club affiliation fees each year, at least in line with CPI increases. Affiliation fees were last increased in 2010 (by 5%). In 2011, affiliation fees were not increased and in 2012 were decreased by 10%, representing a combined saving of more than \$22,000 to WRFL clubs. A further saving to clubs of \$24,000 was achieved by reducing the compulsory insurance premiums charged to clubs in 2012.

Affiliation fees are the only costs charged to clubs and retained by the League to subsidise its operating expenses. Success in recent years in increasing non-club revenue sources, particularly from sponsorship and finals, has enabled the reduction in costs to clubs. Despite recording a small operating loss to the League for the 2011-12 financial year, it is intended that further savings will be passed to clubs next year as the League absorbs an increase in insurance premiums of more than \$16,000 without increasing costs to clubs. The League's budget for 2012-13 has been framed with no increase in club affiliation fees.

While disappointing, the 2011-12 operating loss of \$23,190 represented just 1.3% of a total turnover in excess of \$1.74 million. Some of the key reasons for the unbudgeted loss included reduced interest earnings due to low market interest rates; costs associated with administration and payroll systems for the increased umpire numbers; and a small shortfall in the budgeted income from sponsorship. The lack of support by some clubs for merchandise purchase through the League's properties division was also a contributing factor.

Optimum competition structures and a desire for more even competitions, particularly at senior levels, was a continuing focus during the 2012 season.

Senior club presidents and coaches participated in a series of forums throughout 2011 and 2012, aimed to identify the issues affecting competition balance and possible remedies for the differences in competitive standards between teams at the top and bottom of respective grades. While it was agreed by consensus that the cut-off age for the Under 18 competition should be reduced (by 6 months for the 2013 season and possibly a further 6 months commencing in 2014), it was concluded that the only meaningful improvement in competition structure at senior level would be a move to 3 divisions. It will therefore be a key priority moving forward to develop/attract additional senior-grade clubs to facilitate that aim. At least 24 or 25 senior clubs will be required to support a 3 division competition structure. In that context, the decision of Coburg Districts Football Club to transfer to the Essendon Districts Football League for the 2013 season was disappointing.

Coburg Districts Football Club transferred from EDFL to the then FDFL in 1988 when the club was unable to satisfy the junior team membership criteria imposed on EDFL clubs. For the following 24 years, Coburg Districts FC competed in Division 2 of the FDFL/WRFL, for most of that time with senior teams only. The club was an active participant in the affairs of the League and club President Allan Chandler was awarded WRFL life membership in 2006. However, with the prospect of developing a local junior base, the club has determined to return to the EDFL in 2013. While disappointed to lose any club, we wish Coburg Districts FC every success for the future and thank them for their contribution to the WRFL over the past 24 years.

The loss of Coburg Districts FC is more than compensated by the recent admission of two new clubs – Manor Lakes FC and Sanctuary Lakes FC. Initially planning to commence with junior teams only and to eventually grow to senior ranks, both clubs have received overwhelming response for the immediate provision of both junior and senior teams in their 2013 debut year. While yet to stand the test of market forces, it seems likely that both will compete in 2013 at senior level in division 2, possibly with Under 18s as well as Senior and Reserves teams; and with multiple junior teams on Sundays. We welcome both new clubs and wish them well for long and rewarding futures as part of the WRFL family.

The emergence of new clubs in the Wyndham local government area is neither surprising nor unplanned. As the heartland of the fastest-developing population base in Australia, Wyndham City Council has worked with property developers to

provide state-of-the-art football facilities in all of its new growth areas. Council staff have worked with residents of the new communities, WRFL and AFL Victoria staff to initiate the development of new football clubs to use those facilities. With further major developments already underway in North and South Tarneit, Truganina and Williams Landing; and the recently announced Werribee East precinct alone planned for a further 17,000 residents, WRFL can plan with confidence for several more new clubs in coming years.

The League's capacity to capitalise on the opportunities presented in new growth areas is another product of the 2010 strategic planning process. The Strategic Plan identified strategies to foster new clubs, as well as to assist existing clubs. The decision by the League in the same year to fund the employment of a full-time Club Development Officer has enabled those development strategies to be implemented as the opportunities have arisen. Football Operations and Club Development Officer Tim Shellcot has worked closely with Wyndham Council staff and local community representatives to establish the new clubs. The assistance of AFL Victoria Project Officer Darryl Collings is also gratefully acknowledged.

Thank you to all of the individuals and organisations who have contributed to the success of the Western Region Football League in season 2012. # FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

When reflecting on the success of a season it is the final day on the football calendar that is often looked upon as the reference point in determining the outcome. In that case it is hard not to get excited about the season that was 2012. A one point margin was all that separated Altona and Spotswood at the final siren on that final day of football, with Altona emerging victorious and securing their first Division One premiership. The significance of a new name being engraved on the Division One premiership cup, is reflective of where the WRFL competition is heading.

The Division One & Division Two competitions remained stable in 2012, with ten & eleven teams competing respectively. Deer Park was promoted to Division One and had it not been for an extremely wet Round 18 fixture, a big winning margin may have seen the Lions sneak into the finals, capping off a great first season in the top flight. Glenorden on the other hand found some firm footing following their relegation to Division Two, winning enough games to make the finals & experiencing some terrific crowd support along the way. Season 2013 will welcome two new additions to Division Two with both Manor Lakes Football Club & Sanctuary Lakes Football Club recently gaining admission to the league.

In the Under-Eighteen competition a total of seventeen teams participated across the two divisions. Again the aim was to have the Division One competition aligned with the senior competition to ensure the home and away balance remained constant on a weekly basis. Sunshine Heights, Port Melbourne Colts and North Footscray (withdrew at Round 8) failed to field teams while Point Cook was the only non Division One club to participate in the competition. The Under 18 competition remains a focal point in the review of our senior competition structure. In 2013, the age group will move from under 18 ½ to under 18. This will be closely monitored throughout the season with the plan to further reduce the age eligibility to under 17 ½ in Season 2014. The onus is on the WRFL clubs to ensure the viability of this transition competition, as footballers move from junior to senior level.

Following on from the piloted Under-12 Girls competition in 2011, the WRFL introduced a Youth Girls (13-18 Years) competition and an Under-12 Girls (9-12 Years) competition. Both competitions were contested by five teams and based at JJ Holland Park in Kensington. The standard of football was outstanding and the league is excited that this program will continue to grow in future years. A number of clubs have shown interest in fielding new teams in 2013. Along with the junior competition the total number of teams that participated in season 2012 was 246 with PEGS Juniors (affiliated in Dec 2011) fielding its first junior team in the Under- 10 competition.

A number of individuals excelled at a higher level in 2012 with former Spotswood player Callan Ward being named the first captain of the GWS Giants. Callan had an outstanding season and was awarded the inaugural Kevin Sheedy Medal for the best and fairest player at the club. It was great to see Callan supporting the Woodsmen at Werribee on WRFL Grand Final Day. Mitch Wallis (St Bernard's) followed on from a good debut season in 2011 receiving a NAB Rising Star nomination and finishing fifth in the Western Bulldogs' best and fairest. Wallis' former teammate Luke Mitchell made his debut for Carlton late in the season and will look to become a key focal point in attack under new coach Mick Malthouse in 2013. Former North Sunshine player and top ten draft-pick Will Hoskin-Elliott debuted for the GWS Giants

and had a break-out game late in the season kicking five goals against the Gold Coast Suns. Current Williamstown Juniors' player Lachlan Hunter has been pre-selected as a father son pick and will follow in his dad Mark Hunter's footsteps and join the Western Bulldogs. I would also like to wish the 2011 Herb Pascal medallist & Spotswood Premiership player Torin Baker the best of luck with his recent appointment as coach of the Western Jets.

This season our umpiring numbers continued to grow with 307 umpires registering in 2012. The work of Shane Carland and his team over recent years has been fantastic with the ongoing success of the three umpiring academies and new umpiring program at Scovell Reserve. Shane resigned at season's end after three years at the helm. I would like to thank Shane for the hard work and dedication he has shown in his role, which has led to a significant increase in umpiring numbers since his appointment. Mark Westgarth has been appointed as Shane's replacement and will shift the focus from recruitment to development to ensure the expanding list of new umpires is receiving the best possible coaching & education. I will be working closely with Mark to improve the communications, match day paperwork and club compliance with WRFL By-Laws in Season 2013.

The WRFL Finals Series was played over seven weeks and highlighted the best of what the WRFL has to offer. The junior finals were played over the first four weeks at Crofts Reserve, Altona, North Sunshine & Old Westbourne. Old Westbourne again provided the showpiece of the junior finals series hosting twelve Grand Finals over the final two weeks. In addition the inaugural WRFL Youth Girls finals were played at JJ Holland Park. All venues experienced big crowds who enjoyed professionally run venues by all our host clubs. Like 2011 there was only three junior clubs that didn't have a team participate in the junior finals series. The senior finals series was played at both Crofts Reserve and Avalon Airport Oval in Werribee, where both the Division One & Division Two Grand Finals were played.

It was only percentage that separated ladder leader Altona and Spotswood after the home & away season, with the best defensive team Altona securing the minor premiership over the best attacking team Spotswood. Port Melbourne Colts, Hoppers Crossing and Sunshine rounded out the final five. After the disappointment of their one point loss to Spotswood in the 2011 Preliminary Final, Altona set out to ensure they skipped the Preliminary Final in 2012, defeating Spotswood by eleven points in the Second Semi Final securing the week off and a spot in their first Division One Grand Final. After trailing by 20 points at the final change, Hoppers Crossing over ran Port Melbourne Colts in the First Semi Final to give them a crack at Spotswood the following week. The Preliminary Final saw Hoppers Crossing kick six goals without a minor score in the opening half to keep within arm's length of Spotswood, but the experience of the reigning premiers shone through with a convincing second half allowing Spotswood to win by 48 points. So many factors were pointing to an outstanding Division One Grand Final. It was the sixth successive time Spotswood had been there, while Altona was vying for its first Division One Premiership, and the last two finals the two sides had played against each other were determined by just 11 points & one point. And it definitely didn't disappoint! The match was always in the balance and although Spotswood's 12.18 was enough to beat Albion in the 2011 Grand Final, their identical score line in 2012 wasn't. Leading by six points at the final change, Altona was able

to kick five goals straight to Spotswood's five goals five behinds leaving the narrowest of margins at the final siren. It was enough to ensure Altona's first Division One premiership. Altona defeated Port Melbourne Colts in the Division One Reserves Grand Final giving them the double, while Hoppers Crossing defeated Altona in the Division One Under-18 Grand Final.

For the second year running the Division Two season was dominated by an undefeated Minor Premier, with Yarraville Seddon finishing the home and away season on top. They won convincingly against Parkside in the Second Semi Final, giving them their second week off in three weeks, and a first spot in the Grand Final. Wyndhamvale defeated Coburg Districts in the First Semi Final setting up a showdown with Parkside in the Preliminary Final. The Preliminary Final saw Wyndhamvale kick six unanswered goals and another six behinds in the first quarter giving them a 42 point lead at the first change. Parkside however was able to reduce the margin to only eleven points at the main change with a seven goal second term. Parkside still trailed by nine points at three quarter-time but put the foot down in the last term kicking eight goals to one to run out 38 point winners. The form of Yarraville Seddon throughout the season had most supporters thinking that the Grand Final was going to be a one sided affair. Parkside however, taking plenty of experience from their unexpected Grand Final loss in 2010, had other ideas. They led by fourteen points at the main change and only trailed the firm favourites by two points at the last change. It wasn't until about half way through the last quarter that Yarraville Seddon were able to get on top and although the final margin was 28 points the game was so much closer than the final score indicated. Yarraville Seddon became the second team in as many years to complete an undefeated premiership season. Yarraville Seddon was also successful in the Division Two Reserves, and Hoppers Crossing completed the Under-18 double winning the Division Two Under-18 competition.

Overall the senior finals series was a huge success with great games experienced by record crowds. Thanks to the Yarraville Seddon and Sunshine Heights Football Clubs for hosting the finals as well as the Werribee Football Club and the Wyndham and Hobsons Bay councils for providing fantastic facilities which made the spectator experience a good one.

I would like to thank all clubs who are managed by dedicated and hard working committees and supported each week by a long list of volunteers. It is these people that form the backbone of the WRFL. The Football Operations team is appreciative of the following panels and individuals that ensure our league is continually improving in an ever evolving landscape.

- Tribunal Chairman Dale Sayner and the panel of Independent Tribunal members.
- Retiring Appeals Chairman John Doherty and the panel of Appeal Board members

In Season 2012 the junior competition continued to evolve, with 24 clubs entering 186 teams across 22 divisions, with age groups ranging from Under-9's to Under-16's. While anomalies occurred in the competitiveness of some teams, the league continues to work with all clubs to ensure as many junior players as possible are playing at a level appropriate to their ability. Grading of teams is, and will always remain, a challenge given the differing levels of ability, size and development that occur within each age group. However the league continues to modify the team nomination and grading process, aiming to improve the on-field evenness of games in all competitions. For the first time in a number of years the average winning margin across the junior competition decreased, indicating that policies and procedures implemented by the Western Region Football League administration, clubs and the Juniors Board are taking effect. A further indicator of the junior competition's improving evenness is that a significant majority of our clubs who competed in juniors in 2012 had at least one team participate in the finals series, and of the fifteen junior premierships on offer, eleven different clubs achieved the ultimate goal of a grand final victory.

The junior finals series showcased the high quality of underage football in the west, and each finals venue experienced good crowds and exciting football. Our thanks go to the clubs who hosted junior finals (Old Westbourne, Altona Juniors, Sunshine Heights & North Sunshine), with each club's excellent management of their venues ensuring the success of the junior finals series. Following the completion of the playing season the junior competition finished in style at the annual Junior Presentation Night at Wyndham Cultural Centre. Seating close to 500 people, the centre was at capacity for the first time with players, parents and guests acknowledging the premiership teams and best and fairest winners for Season 2012.

In a significant milestone the WRFL welcomed the Youth Girls competition into its ranks, with five teams competing on Saturday mornings at JJ Holland Park in Kensington. In past years the ten team Western Region Youth Girls competition had been managed by AFL Victoria, but as part of the development plan for female football, management is now undertaken by community leagues. With five teams now under the WRFL banner and five under the control of the EDFL, the two leagues joined forces to enter the Western Region Youth Girls interleague team to play in the AFL Victoria Metropolitan Championships. The WRFL's Youth Girls were accompanied by the league's first formal Under-12 Girls competition, again with five teams competing. Participation in female football has increased significantly in the past five years and with Youth Girls and Under-12 Girls competitions now under WRFL management, the aim is to build participation and increase both club & player numbers in 2013 and beyond.

Seven squads represented the WRFL in male junior Interleague matches in 2012. Congratulations go to the Under-13's for successfully defending the

perpetual shield won in 2011 following a round robin competition against the EDFL & RDFL. The Under-13 squad also had the opportunity to play an additional full length game against the EDFL, and despite losing a close match it provided a valuable experience for players in this age group. In conjunction with the Western Jets, a talent identification night to assist in selection of our initial Under-14 interleague training squad for Season 2013 was held immediately following the completion of the junior finals series. This initiative was attended by approximately 100 of our current Under-13 age group players, and was well received by players, parents and clubs.

The Under-14 and Under-15 interleague squads again competed in the annual AFL Victoria Metropolitan Championships. Each squad played competitive football however didn't win enough games to progress through to the finals. Regardless of the results, the interleague experience for the Under-14 & Under-15 age groups is invaluable as they seek to develop their football, and to provide an arena in which each player receives challenges to their ability and



temperament that they may not have received in club football. The league is keen to balance the benefits of providing development opportunities with the desire to win games, and modifications to the Under-14 & Under-15 programs will be made in 2013 with the goal of gaining better outcomes in both these areas.

The interleague program could not function without the time and effort of the coaching staff, in particular the Head Coach of each squad: Cam Atkins (Under-12), Lee Gilmore (Under-13), Tony Wright (Under-14 - Division One), Colin Clohesy (Under-14 - Division Two), Gary Brennan (Under-15 - Division One), Vinnie Turcinovich (Under 15 - Division Two), & Daniel Xuereb (Under-16). Each coach also receives assistance from players' parents and friends to perform key roles such as team manager and the WRFL thanks those people for their support of the junior interleague program. A number of WRFL clubs hosted interleague training and/or matches, and thanks go to North Sunshine, Parkside, Sunshine Heights & Western Jets football clubs for making their facilities and volunteers available to assist in the development of the WRFL's best junior talent.

Following the conclusion of the 2012 playing season exciting developments have taken place in the City of Wyndham. The WRFL has a stated goal to increase its number of affiliate clubs in senior ranks, to allow formation of a third division of senior football. Significant steps towards this goal have been taken with the formation of Manor Lakes Football Club and Sanctuary Lakes Football Club, and both clubs will enter senior and junior teams in their inaugural season in 2013. While the WRFL, AFL Victoria and Wyndham Council have had significant input in creating both clubs I congratulate the members of the community who have shown the vision and drive to get involved, and who will now play crucial roles in ensuring the viability and sustainability of each club. The formation of these clubs has also been a great learning tool for WRFL administration, and the knowledge and experience gained will be invaluable as the league seeks to meet the demands for football driven by the rapidly increasing population in the outer west.

It is important to acknowledge that the issues our volunteers face in developing and maintaining their clubs can be very diverse, with the large population growth in the outer western area of the league creating different needs to those clubs in the inner west. Addressing these needs remains an ongoing challenge, and research undertaken during 2012 by both the WRFL and AFL Victoria will provide the base on which strategies aimed at providing more individualised support can be developed.

The Juniors Board, chaired by Keith Brown, continued to provide vital strategic advice to both WRFL administration and the Executive Board on the format, structure and functioning of the junior football competition. Board input was welcomed on a range of important issues, in particular the structure of the

competition prior to commencement of the 2012 season and on changes made to team placements following round four of the home and away competition, and the Board is now considering items of strategic importance to the competition in 2013 and beyond.

Finally, thanks to WRFL staff Bob Tregear, David Newton, Lyn McLeod, Cam Nation, Peter Harley, Kim Peak, Andrew Muscat and Kristy Vidovic, and to AFL Victoria's Darryl Collings for their advice and assistance throughout 2012, and to the many club volunteers who continue to be the lifeblood of the WRFL. We all look forward to a successful 2013 season.

## UMPIRES

Umpiring in the Western Region Football League has had an exceptional year, with membership figures reaching an all time high of 307. This year saw all Saturday games filled with Field, Boundary & Goal appointments, with 95% of junior games also officiated by league umpires.

The league would like to thank Terry O'Donnell and the recruiting panel Mark Westgarth, Henry McFerran, Anthea Walshe & Peter Daghish, who all undertook the tireless task of visiting schools and promoting umpiring. It is this hard work which is the premier reason for the massive growth in umpiring numbers in the WRFL, with involvement increasing almost threefold over a three year period.

Next year bigger challenges await, particularly in the recruitment & retention of umpires. A high standard has been set and things should not be taken for granted as the umpiring fraternity needs to continue to facilitate further growth. It is also imperative that there is continued work to attract former players into umpiring. We can also improve the retention of umpires, primarily through the education of supporters, coaches and players, on showing respect to all umpires at all times.

This year we saw a growth in female umpiring, with numbers reaching an all-time high of thirty. A special thanks to the Michetti sisters, Rosie and Bianca, along with Anthea Walshe. With their friendliness and performances on the track and in games, they have encouraged a whole new wave of females to join and officiate within our league.

The Umpiring Academies continue to grow in numbers, and keep producing talented junior umpires. I would like to thank our team of Mark Westgarth, Anthea Walshe, Peter Robertson (Mackillop College) Phil Henderson, Bianca Michetti (Caroline Springs) Peter Daghish, Luke Wilke, Paul Battaglia, Rene Van Kuyk (Maribyrnong College) and Mark Mather (Scovell Reserve), for their tireless work in this field.

Another strength of the Umpiring Department this season was the invaluable contribution of our coaching staff who continue to play a key role in maintaining the high standard of umpiring in the league, in particular Graeme Hodgart, Leo Keating & John Manikis (Goals), Richard Watt & Alan Pascoe (Boundaries), Ross Walker & Mark Mather (Field), and Dean Portelli (Fitness). In addition we thank the specialist coaches Adrian O'Donnell, Paul DiMartino, Brett Carter & Jarrod Walker. The efforts of these coaches should not be underestimated as they continue to work hard to recruit & retain umpires whilst developing their skills and fostering a positive working environment.

With the continued development of junior umpires, the gap between junior & senior officiating is gradually closing, with many juniors officiating senior football for the first time in 2012. This is a great credit to our staff & mentors. The junior umpiring department was led by Rene Van Kuyk & Mark Mather, who did a magnificent job organising such a large base of junior umpires. They were supported by mentors, whose help and support of the younger umpires plays a key role in their development.

## TRIBUNAL

This season saw a fourteen percent reduction in cases at the Tribunal, with 68 hearings (down from 77 last season). While this is a positive for the league, there is still room for improvement, particularly in regards to offences by club officials.

Club officials are matchday leaders within the league, and therefore should uphold the core values of both their club and the Western Region Football League. Unfortunately this season there was an increase in reportable incidents involving club officials, with eight cases being heard. In all eight cases the officials were handed a guilty verdict, with a maximum penalty of five years. The Tribunal deems these offences as extremely serious especially given these individuals should be the ones setting the example at their clubs, and subsequently the penalties handed out by the Tribunal this season reflects the severity of these incidents.

On a positive note there were only eight umpire related charges in 2012, which although still unacceptable, is a reduction from previous years. The total umpire related charges equated to twenty-four percent of all Tribunal hearings this season.

Moving forward the Tribunal panel will be looking at increasing penalties for 'deliberate kicking' & 'striking behind play' charges in the coming seasons. The panel heard ten cases this year that fell into this category with five serious striking charges receiving penalties ranging from 8-12 weeks. There was also five deliberate kicking charges with penalties ranging from 8 -14 weeks. This is of particular concern for the Tribunal given the serious nature of these offences, and that they amounted to fifteen percent of all charges heard this year.

There is still concern at the Tribunal with the number of junior cases being heard each season, with twenty-six cases heard in 2012. This equates to thirty-eight percent of all cases heard this season. It is alarming that of these cases, seven were from the Under-14 age group, and five were from the Under-16 age group. This caseload reiterates the importance of setting an example for our junior players, and the challenge now lies with our club officials, coaches & parents to curb this disturbing trend. These figures send the wrong message to the community at a time when our game is losing ground to other sports.

In line with last season the representation from clubs at the Tribunal with relation to advocates was generally poor. Every year the league gives all clubs ample opportunity to accredit advocates, yet involvement continues to be low. This year we had nineteen clubs attend. A special thanks to Adrian Noble & Michael McNamara for their support. In 2013 we will aim to hold more nights, and in line with 2012, these will be in central areas, eliminating travelling time for those attendees.

Once again we opted to have a small panel of Tribunal members in 2012, aimed at ensuring the consistency of penalties handed down. A special thanks to all the sitting members who supported both me and the Deputy Chairman Adrian Noble, in making sure that there were always sufficient panel numbers to deal with the varying number of cases on a Tuesday night.

The Tribunal Panel Members for Season 2012 were: Adrian Noble (Deputy Chair), Jim Simmonds (Deputy Chair), Michael McNamara, Ben Sutherland, Paul Madja, Rod Evans & Darren Mayne. Brian Wilson, the Tribunal Secretary, did an outstanding job this year. Even though he suffered with a serious illness during the season, Brian showed what an asset he was to the WRFL by being back in the seat as soon as his health turned for the better.

Thanks to all the clubs and umpires who attended the Tribunal this year. The co-operation extended and given was always in the best interest of fair play and the integrity of the WRFL. Looking forward to season 2013, I trust all clubs, players & officials will heed the advice outlined in this report, as we aim to get the number of cases heard to below thirty for the season.

## MEDIA

### Cam Nation

The Western Region Football League continues to embrace the evolving technology confronting the media sector, as we move to more real-time & interactive media beyond the simple print medium. This is led primarily by our website, which continues to be the number one reference point for our members in search of information, results, fixtures & league documents. Capturing this audience to make their online interaction more than just checking the weekend's scores has been a key part of this season's media strategy.

The website has also embraced a number of other mediums to extend a user's interactivity online, notably our weekly photo galleries on Picasa, our live score feed on Twitter, our forum on Facebook, and our video channel on Youtube. Our video channel hosted the return of our Senior Web TV Show in 2012, presented by Kevin Hillier & Steven Thom, and our new Junior Footy Show which screened during the junior finals series. The final Junior Footy Show of the season gained a remarkable online following, with thousands of users logging on over a one-week period to make it our most successful & viewed show to date.

In Season 2012 the league also pursued the commercialisation of our website, and engaged the services of several online advertising agencies with significant success. While the revenue stream was only modest in the opening six months, throughout the year a number of different approaches were trialled and the league will be well placed to prepare a more thorough advertising strategy in 2013 based on the experiences of this season.

The 2012 season also saw the continuation of our more conventional media streams, with our weekly Footy Record distributed at all senior games adding to the spectator experience while giving some valuable exposure to our partners, advertisers & suppliers. As per previous seasons the league also published a Junior Footy Record during the junior finals series, which continues to be popular amongst parents as both a source of information and a memento of their child's participation in the finals series.

Finally the radio team continued their good work throughout the season, anchored by Kevin Hillier with the assistance of Steve Thom, Adam Lux, Andrew Muscat, Briony Ford & Matt Hellman. The weekly broadcast, post-game show and Friday night preview show continued to give a valuable insight into all facets of the league. The broadcasts also embraced the changing nature of radio, with the signal updated from a fixed analogue line to a digital signal, enabling the team to broadcast from venues that were previously inaccessible. The advent of I-Phone & Android applications and live streaming online also increased our radio audience from just those that fall within the WYN FM coverage area, to anyone with an internet connection.

In just two short seasons the league has made significant improvements in how we interact with members, and our online presence and interactivity continues to lead the way amongst the metropolitan leagues. For the first time we are starting to see the financial benefits of our large volume of web-traffic, with our annual increase in traffic the result of the range of content being provided to users online. Further embracing new developments in modern media, particularly given the age of our large membership base of juniors, will continue to be the league's foremost goal in the coming season. This includes ensuring our online content is both phone & tablet compatible, and that we provide enough relevant content for all users.

Coordinating the league's media operations couldn't be done without the support of the WRFL office staff and a range of contributors from both clubs & the broader league, and I thank all of those that have contributed over the 2012 season. Of particular note I would like to congratulate Graeme Hodgart on receiving the Media Award for his contributions to our 'Umpires Corner' section of the Footy Record over the past two seasons. It has been an enjoyable experience guiding the league's media strategy over the past two seasons, and I look forward to the challenges that await in 2013.

## NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2012

### 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981, for use by the members of the League and to fulfil the board's requirements to prepare financial statements.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 and the following Accounting Standards:

AASB 101	Presentation of Financial Statements
AASB 107	Cash Flow Statements
AASB 108	Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied. The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements and consistently applied to all periods covered.

#### PROPERTY, PLANT & EQUIPMENT

Items of property, plant and equipment are carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment loss. Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the income and expenditure statement during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant & equipment are determined by comparing the proceeds from disposal with the carrying amount, and are recognised net within other income in the income and expenditure statement.

#### DEPRECIATION

Depreciation is calculated on the depreciable amount of all fixed assets over their useful lives commencing from time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation methods and rates used for each class of assets are as follows:

Office Equipment – Diminishing value method	15% to 20%
Motor Vehicles – Diminishing value method	18.75%
Computer Equipment – Diminishing value method	40%
Leasehold Improvements – Straight line over 3 lease terms (9 years)	
Furniture & Fittings – Diminishing value method	7.5% to 20%
Assets held for Club Use – Prime cost method	10%

Depreciation methods, useful lives and residual values are reviewed at each financial year end and adjusted if appropriate.

#### LEASES

Operating leases do not transfer substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to ownership of an asset.

Payments made under an operating lease are recognised in the expenditure statement on a straight line basis over the term of the lease. The leased assets are not recognised in the balance sheet of the association.

#### INVENTORIES

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost is based on the first in, first out principle and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the inventories and other costs associated with bringing them to their existing location and condition. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated selling expenses.

#### EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

#### INCOME TAX

The League has been granted an income tax exemption by the Australian Taxation Office.

#### GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense. Receivables and payables are stated with amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included as a current asset or liability in the balance sheet.

#### REVENUE RECOGNITION

##### Property Division Sales

Property Division Sales represent revenue earned from the sale of products to member clubs. Revenue is recorded when the goods are despatched.

##### Interest Income

Interest Income is recognised as it accrues.

##### Management Fees

Management Fees represent revenue earned from charges to member clubs used to fund the provision of services (including but not limited to umpires).

##### Asset Sales

The profit or loss on disposal of assets is included as revenue of the association. Such profit or loss on disposal of assets is brought to account at the date an unconditional contract of sale is signed.

## 3. OPERATING LEASES

The League has two operating leases, one for the rental of the office and one for computer equipment.

### OFFICES

There has been a Memorandum of Understanding signed by the League as sub-leasee to Western Bulldogs Football Club. It and the draft lease received provide for terms of 3 years with seven 3 year options totalling 21 years, commencing May 2010. Rental is reviewed annually in May and is subject to a CPI increase. For the purposes of this note, a CPI increase each year of 3.5% has been assumed.

### COMPUTER EQUIPMENT

The operating lease for the computer equipment is a 36 month lease which commenced in September 2010. Last payment is due in August 2013.
