Our Mission

The Football Foundation exists to unite the football community in Queensland for the love of our game. Our mission is to provide opportunities for everyone involved in football to enjoy the game and thrive.

We believe that for football to truly excel in Queensland, we must strengthen three important pillars. Those pillars are:

- Every Income
- Every Gender
- Every Ability

Our Pillars



To provide children from low-income families opportunities to play at the highest level and pursue their football dreams.



To provide women and girls in football with the appropriate support and avenues to excel on and off the field.



To provide people who experience learning, perceptual and physical difficulties with more opportunities to play football.

How Funds Are Operated

Tax deductible donations can be made directly to the Football Foundation via the Australian Sports Foundation (ASF), where funds are distributed by Football Queensland to develop various areas within Football.

Alternatively, donations can be made to a specific pillar (Every Income, Every Gender, Every Ability) of the foundation, where the funds will be utilised to develop that specific area within Football.



Governance

Integral to the success of the Football Foundation is the governance structure. Behind every well-functioning charitable body is a robust governance system.

The Football Foundation benefits from the appointment of a sub-committee that acts as trustees for the organisation.

Responsibilities include management of the body's direction, overseeing the distribution of its funds and ensuring the body's compliance with the law.




Football – What they see

- 2nd highest full active members
- Highest Junior participation of **any** sport 56,566 players
- **316 Clubs** out of 4216 sporting clubs in the state are **football** clubs
- Limited funding from FFA unlike other large codes, no broadcast rights

Programs

- **State Development Program** (\$40K a year for 3 years to deliver State Championships and \$75K for a 5 year state-wide facilities plan)
- **Get Started Vouchers** (\$150 vouchers to assist eligible children with the costs for participation fees)
- **Get Going Clubs** (\$7500 towards projects that improve club capabilities)
- **Get Playing Places & Spaces** (Funding of up to \$150K to assist with the development of places and spaces that encourage Queenslanders to become in sport and active recreation)
- **Get Playing Plus** (\$200K-\$1.5 mil for new/upgraded places and spaces which increase participation, meet service gaps and address community needs)
- **Get Planning Program** (\$100K for organisation to develop quality infrastructure planning to improve quality decision making)
- **Get Out Get Active** (One-off funding of up to \$40K for not-for-profit organisations to provide new sport and recreation opportunities for women and girls)
- **Young Athlete Travel Subsidy** (financial assistance to help alleviate the costs associated with attending championship events. State/State school event \$200, National/National school event \$400 or International event \$600)
- **Female Facilities** (NEW \$15 million program, to be announced soon)
- **S&R Disaster Recovery**

Football Queensland State-Wide Facilities Plan (2017-2021)

Developed to identify and prioritise football facility needs across Queensland and improve the quality of evidence-based decision making for the sport.

Proposed Methodology for Plan *(Expanded)*

Stage 1

- Inception meeting and steering committee workshop
- Research, literature review, data collection and analysis
- Preliminary engagement with FQ Zones

Stage 2

- Online engagement with members of the football family across Queensland
- Engagement with peak bodies
- Engagement with councils
- Zone planning workshops

Stage 3

- Preparation of draft Football Queensland State-Wide Facilities Strategic Plan
- Targeted follow-up engagement

Stage 4

- Finalisation of the Football Queensland State-Wide Facilities Strategic Plan, 2017-2021
